οἱ δ' ἐπεὶ εἰσῆλθον κλυτὰ δώματα, τὴν δὲ γυναικα

ἡ δ' αἴψι ἐξ ἀγορῆς ἐκάλει κλυτὸν Ἀντιφατῆα,
δὸν πόσιν, δὸς δὴ τοῖσιν ἐμήσατο λυγρὸν ὅλεθρον.
αὐτίχ' ἔνα μάρψας ἑτάρων ὠπλίσσατο δεῖπνον:
τὰ δὲ δύ' ἀΐζαντε φυγῇ ἐπὶ νῆας ἵκεσθην.

παίδων ἡδ' ἀλόχων, οὐδ' ἄλλήλων ἀλέγουσι.
there are neither council-bearing *agorai* nor ordinances,
but they in lofty mountains dwell,
in hollow caves, and each determines the rules
for his children and wives, nor do they care for one another.
